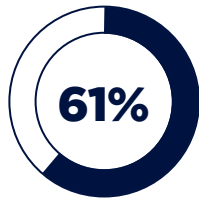

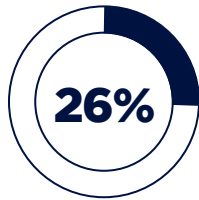

Graduate Students Fall 2022

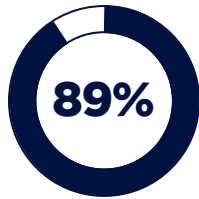

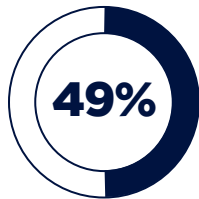
